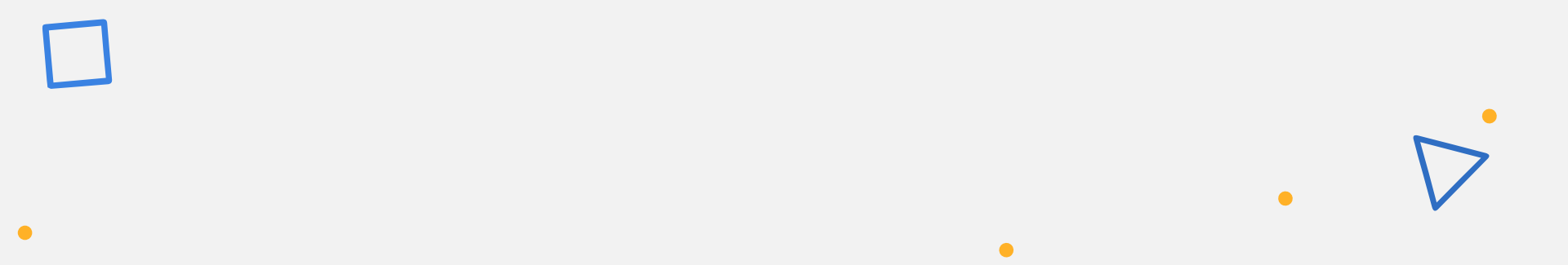


Debate club in our school





Structure of debate

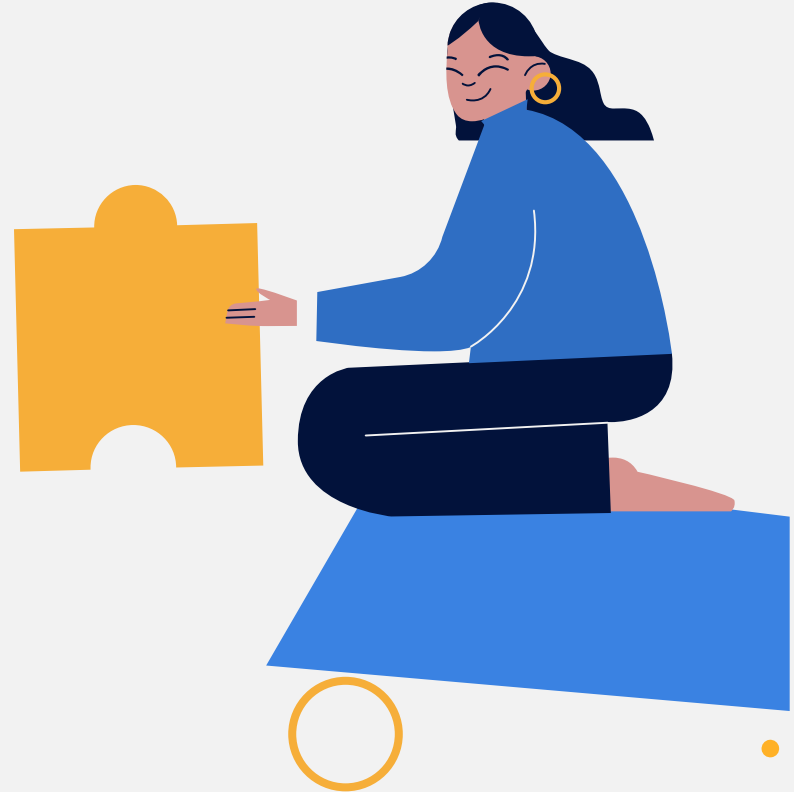
- **6 Participants**

 - **We debate in both languages. (English and Lithuanian)**

Proposition team

The proposition team proposes the motion, meaning they argue in favor of the motion.

Opposition team

The opposition team opposes the motion, meaning that they argue against the motions.

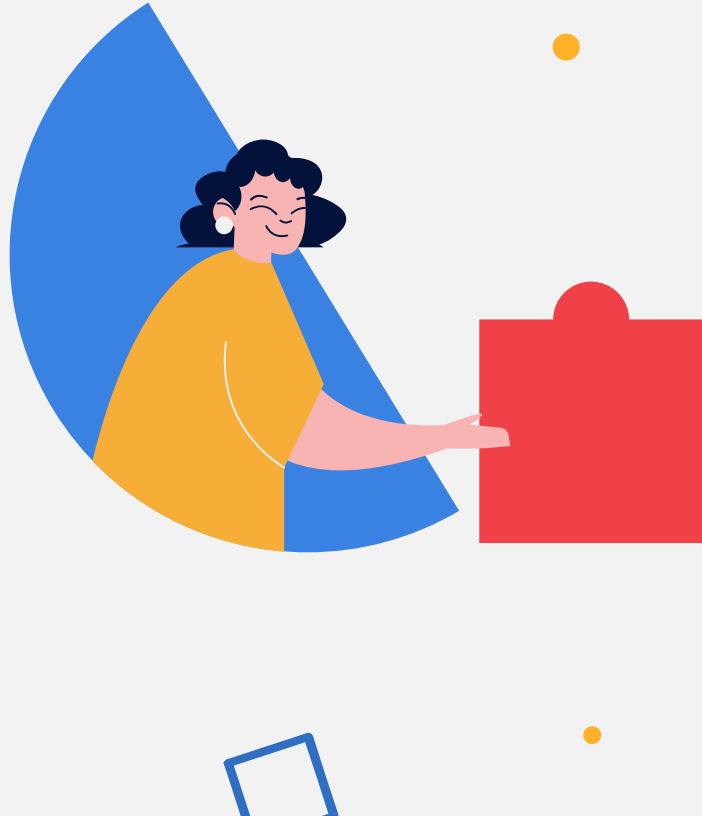

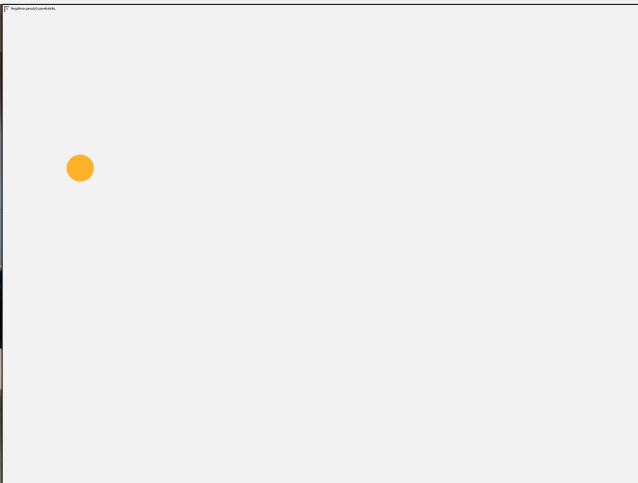

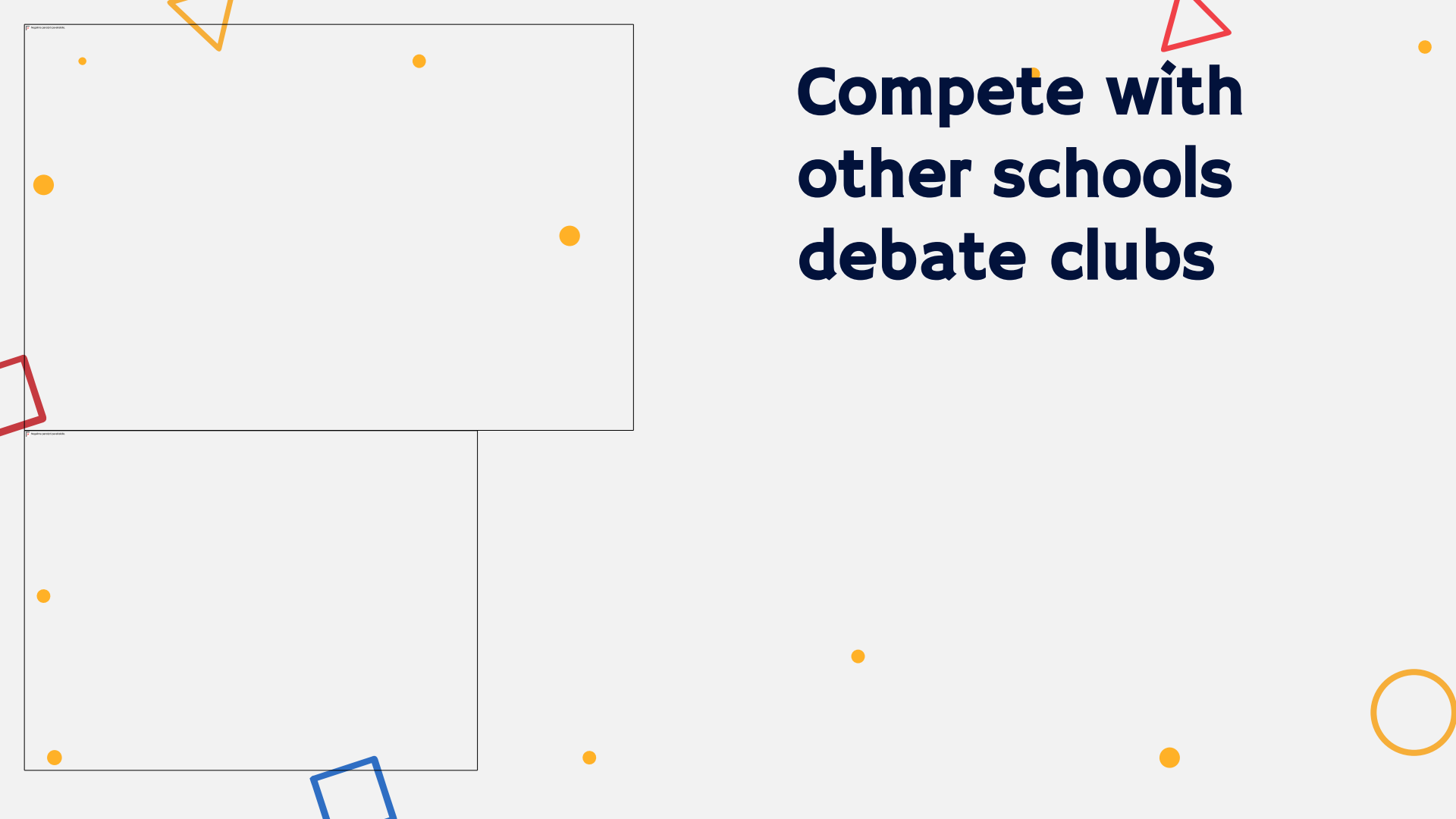
